Answers for Daily Meditation on the Old Testament – Week 32

Sunday – [Proverbs 1](#)

1. Solomon, son of David, King of Israel.
2. To give wisdom in righteousness, justice, equity, prudence, & discretion.
3. The fear of the LORD. We should fear, love, & trust in God above all things.
4. Solom prayed for wisdom to rule God's people, and God granted his request.

Monday – [1 Samuel 12](#)

1. The LORD and His anointed, King Saul (also an inference to Christ).
2. People forgot God, God disciplines, people repent, God sends deliverer.
3. It will be well, but if they rebel, the hand of the LORD will be against them.
4. Remembering what great things the LORD has done for them.

Tuesday – [1 Samuel 13](#)

1. He musters & commands an army to fight against the enemy Philistines.
2. Saul disobeys God and makes the offering without God's appointed servant.
3. His kingdom would end, but God would raise up another man after His heart.
4. The Philistines had thousands of chariots & horsemen; Israel had no swords.

Wednesday – [1 Samuel 14](#)

1. The LORD, who can save by many or by few.
2. The LORD threw the Philistines into panic, tumult, and confusion.
3. Saul cursed any man who ate food until he was avenged on his enemies.
4. Saul vowed that Jonathan should die, but the people interceded for him.

Thursday – [1 Samuel 15](#)

1. Saul does not destroy all, but he spares the king and the best of their herds.
2. To obey the LORD is better than sacrifice and to listen than the fat of rams.
3. The LORD rejects him as king and gives the kingdom of Israel to another man.
4. Saul confesses his sin, seeks pardon, and worships the LORD.

Friday – [1 Samuel 16](#)

1. Man looks on the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.
2. The Holy Spirit came upon David from that day forward.
3. The Holy Spirit left Saul, and the LORD allowed a demon to torment him.
4. When David played his lyre, the demon departed, and Saul was refreshed.

Saturday – [Jeremiah 36](#)

1. Write on a scroll all the words the LORD has given him the past 23 years so the people will repent that God may forgive their iniquity and sin.
2. Read the scroll to the people in the LORD's house so they will repent.
3. He burned the scroll in the fire. He became the first Bible burner.
4. Jeremiah dictated another scroll to Baruch and prophesied that Jehoiakim would have no descendant on the throne. The royal line of David was cursed.
