Answers for Daily Meditation on the New Testament – Week 9

Sunday – [Romans 16](#)

1. They risked their lives for Paul. Their church met in their home.
2. To watch out for those who cause divisions by teaching false doctrine.
3. Tertius served as a scribe to whom Paul dictated his letter.
4. With a doxology (words of glory) which give glory to God.

Monday – [Matthew 22:1-22](#)

1. God the Father, God the Son, prophets, unbelieving Jews, and Gentiles.
2. Wearing the wedding clothes that God gives us, the righteousness of Christ.
3. A yes answer would lose favor with the Jews; a no answer would be treason.
4. Jesus recognizes two kingdoms by honoring both government and God.

Tuesday – [Matthew 22:23-46](#)

1. By their farfetched, hypothetical question about marriage in heaven.
2. Not "I was the God of Abraham" but "I am" meaning that he still lives now.
3. Love God and love your neighbor.
4. By showing that to be both David's son & Lord, He must be both man & God.

Wednesday – [Matthew 23](#)

1. Do what they say according to the Law of Moses but don't do their hypocrisy.
2. Like whitewashed tombs - outwardly righteous but inwardly hypocrites.
3. They would persecute and kill them just like their fathers did to the prophets.
4. The people would not. They rejected Jesus and suffered the consequences.

Thursday – [Matthew 24:1-28](#)

1. When will the Temple be destroyed and when will you come on the Last Day.
2. False Christs, wars, famines, earthquakes, persecution and martyrdom of disciples, abomination in the Temple.
3. Flee from Jerusalem and Judea to the mountains.
4. False teachers who direct them to false Christs, saying Christ has come.

Friday – [Matthew 24:29-51](#)

1. Those who rejected Jesus, particularly the Jewish leaders. ([Matthew 26:64](#))
2. Jesus will send out His apostles and messengers to gather His Church.
3. Within one generation, 70 A.D.
4. No one knows, nor would there be any signs, but the Lord will come suddenly

Saturday – [1 Corinthians 1](#)

1. The Lord Jesus Christ on Paul's journey to Damascus.
2. That they agree on doctrine with no quarrelsome divisions over leaders.
3. Christ crucified on the cross for the salvation of the world.
4. Not the wise, powerful, & noble of the world, but the foolish, lowly, & weak of the world so that no one could boast of themselves but only in the Lord.
